

INSTRUCTION FOR THE PRESENTATION OF ABSTRACT AND POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Please read the information below carefully.

As in previous years, a number of invited speakers (Invited speakers) will discuss a current theme. Some of these sessions are supplemented with (abstracts) which can be submitted by any healthcare professional and presented by the 1st author. In some other sessions, including for example the sessions of the NFN Fall Meeting 2021, only abstracts are presented.

Important:

You are obliged to show the disclosure of the CGR to your audience at the start of your presentation. This is a PowerPoint slide that you will find on the same page of our website as this instruction. Failure to include this slide may lead to sanctions from the IGJ.

You present your abstract in one of the following 4 presentation formats:

1. Oral abstract presentations:

- Speaking time for a medical / clinical or basic scientific abstract is 10 minutes: approximately 8 minutes of presentation and 2 minutes of discussion. This limited time means that your presentation can consist of up to 8-10 slides.
- The speaking time for a paramedical abstract is 10 minutes: approximately 8 minutes of lecture and 2 minutes of discussion. This limited time means that your presentation can consist of up to 8-10 slides.

The moderators are explicitly instructed to request the relevant speaker to end the nomination if the time is exceeded. The time of your presentation can be found in the digital program book.

You must record your nomination in advance. Instructions for making a video can be found under point 3 of the instruction for the speakers. This instruction can be found on this page of the website.

The video may last a maximum of 8 minutes. You can then have a live discussion with the participants. Make sure you are logged in to the platform.

Language of instruction:

Medical / clinical and basic science sessions must be presented in English.

Paramedic abstracts must be presented in Dutch.

2. Oral bullet poster presentations (medical / clinical or basic scientific only):

Speaking time for a bullet poster presentation is 7 minutes: 5 minutes of lecture and 2 minutes of discussion and 2 minutes of discussion. This limited time means that your presentation can consist of up to 2-4 slides.

The moderators are explicitly instructed to request the relevant speaker to end the nomination if the time is exceeded. The time of your presentation can be found in the digital program book.

You must record your nomination in advance. Instructions for making a video can be found under point 3 of the instruction for the speakers. This instruction can be found on this page of the website.

The video may last a maximum of 5 minutes. You can then have a live discussion with the participants. Make sure you are logged in to the platform.

Language of instruction:

The oral bullet posters must be presented in English.

3. E-poster presentations (medical / clinical or basic scientific only):

The speaking time for an E-poster is 5 minutes: approximately 3 minutes of presentation and 2 minutes of discussion. E-posters consist of 1 slide.

The moderators are explicitly instructed to request the relevant speaker to end the nomination if the time is exceeded. The time of your presentation can be found in the digital program book.

You must record your nomination in advance. Instructions for making a video can be found under point 3 of the instruction for the speakers. This instruction can be found on this page of the website.

The video may last a maximum of 3 minutes. You can then have a live discussion with the participants. Make sure you are logged in to the platform.

Language of instruction:

Medical / clinical and basic science sessions must be presented in English.
